Sehr geehrte Damen und Herren,  
liebe Kolleginnen und Kollegen

ICTswitzerland, die Dachorganisation der Verbände sowie der Anbieter- und Anwenderunternehmen von Informations- und Kommunikationstechnologien (ICT), freut sich, Sie mit dem Programm zum 6. Parlamentarierseminar vom 28. – 31. Oktober 2014 in Shenzhen begrüßen zu dürfen.

Als bedeutender ICT-Standort und wichtiger Wirtschaftspartner der Schweiz bietet Shenzhen sowohl mit der rasant wachsenden Wirtschaft als auch aufgrund der vielen Unterschiede bezüglich Kultur, Politik und Wirtschaftsordnung ein besonders belebendes und inspirierendes Umfeld für einen spannenden Dialog, der sich durch das gesamte Seminarprogramm zieht. Shenzhen liegt 30 km nördlich von Hongkong und ist innerhalb von etwas mehr als 30 Jahren von einem kleinen Fischerdorf zu einer Metropole mit rund 15 Mio. Einwohnern herangewachsen. Zusammen mit den Megastädten Hongkong und Guangzhou gehört Shenzhen zum Pearl River Delta, welches 60 Mio. Einwohner und 55'000 km<sup>2</sup> umfasst und das höchste Pro-Kopf Einkommen Chinas aufweist. Diese Region ist der wirtschaftliche Hot Spot Asiens mit Schwerpunkten in der Hightech basierten Industrie (ICT, Automotive, Biotech etc.) sowie im Bank- und Finanzwesen (vor allem Hongkong). Zudem wird über die Häfen dieser Region das weltweit grösste Handelsvolumen auf dem Seeweg abgewickelt.

Nick Adamus | Managing Director and Chief Operating Officer Asia Pacific, Credit Suisse



Nick Adamus is a Managing Director and the Chief Operating Officer for Asia Pacific at Credit Suisse, with a regional reporting line to the CEO for Asia Pacific. He is a member of the Asia Pacific Operating Committee.

Robert Wiest | Managing Director, Head of Strategy & Operations Asia , Swiss Re Hong Kong

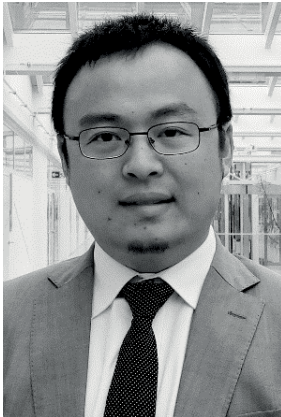

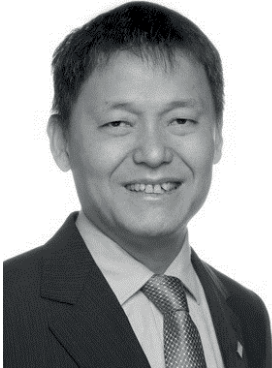
Mr. Xu has held several senior-level positions at Huawei throughout his tenure with the company.

Er engagiert weiter als Mitglieder des ständigen Ausschusses der Shenzhen Stadt, als Vizepräsident der General Handelskammer, als Supervisor des Mittleren Volksgerichts der Stadt Shenzhen und als besondere Aufsichtsbehörden der Stadt Shenzhen Supervision Amt.
